
The new possibilities linked to the NWFPs, the green economy and the transition to a climate-neutral economy are a clear opportunity for economic development, especially in rural areas, which will always result in the fixation of population and an opportunity for the integration of the disadvantaged groups.

Non-wood forest products (NWFP) are an important source of income and a fundamental pillar that sustains the concept of multifunctional forest. As it is a relatively new activity, there is a gap of specific training tools adapted to the population that can access these new resources. This is the reason for developing a competence that addresses this forest aspects, which at the same time favours the strengthening of key competences that affect the whole EU.



OBJECTIVES

- Develop new skills for adult education and training resources supported by ICT, with an innovative and multidisciplinary approach, on sustainable multifunctional forests.
- Contribute to using the forest and its non-wood products as a means of integrating vulnerable social sectors in rural areas, reincorporating unskilled adults, women and youth into the labor market.
- Promote innovative sustainable forest management practices to increase the carbon sink capacity of forests and resilience to Climate Change
- Promote information transfer, adult education and employment at local, regional, national and European level.
- Promote the implementation of training and cooperation networks between different sectors and countries in Europe (adult education, forestry and NTFP sector, sustainable management, rural development, environment, etc.) involving all actors in training.
- Support social awareness about environmental and climate challenges.

VULNER ABLE SOCIAL GROUPS
